READINGS

First Reading: Isaiah 42: 1~4, 6~7

Psalms 29: The Lord will bless his
people with peace.

Second Reading: Acts 10: 34~38

Gospel: Luke 3: 15~16, 21~22



Today's feast day invites us to respond to the calling of our baptism. God delights in us. We are one with the risen Christ and his Spirit is upon us.

In union with Christ we are called to act with compassion, justice and integrity in order to reveal God's kingdom to the 'nations'. **(First Reading)**

Fittingly, the **Psalms** for today's feast overflows with the imagery of water. The Holy Spirit breathed her wisdom across

the primordial waters in the creation story.

In the **Second Reading**, Peter proclaims Jesus Christ (the 'Anointed One') as Lord of all.

Then in **the Gospel**, the Spirit descends upon Jesus when John baptises him in the River Jordan. This is another new beginning blessed by the Spirit. Jesus is anointed by God and begins his ministry to live out the good news that was proclaimed by Isaiah.

For we who call ourselves Christian, we are united with Christ through our baptism, we share in his priesthood and are tasked with transforming the world through living out his Gospel values of love, compassion and justice.

Let us pray that throughout the whole Church, there will be a spirit of renewal, enlivened and enriched by the gifts of the Spirit

A MODEL FOR OUR PRAYER LIFE

The Advent/Christmas cycle that began on November 30th, 2025 ends with the Baptism of the Lord. We likely have an image in our minds (based on details from the Gospels and works of art) of what the scene looked like. We might wonder, "Who else was there and who wasn't?" No disciples were present because Jesus had not yet begun his ministry. They would have to wait until the Transfiguration to hear a similar message. However, the three

persons of the Blessed Trinity are accounted for: the Father (the voice from heaven), the Son Jesus, and the Holy Spirit. Interestingly, Luke alone notes that it was after Jesus had been baptized and while he was praying that the voice was heard. All of the Gospels show Jesus praying which is the turning point in his ministry; this is but the first example of Jesus' need to root himself in prayer throughout his life ~ a model for us to follow.
